### Longstone Park/Kingsknowe Road North (Near Scotmid)

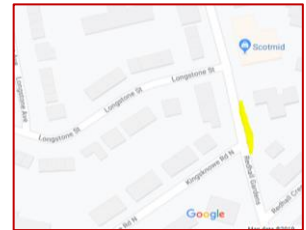
